## **Conditions for Burning:**

- Permit will be issued depending on the weather/FDR. Please contact our office in the morning of the burn for the final permission from GSFPA.
- Herewith the applicant is granted permission to perform a controlled burn of the material on site as declared to GSFPA.
- Adequate liaison with surrounding landowners and other parties must take place. Make sure that you have notified your neighbours and have been granted permission.

- The issuing Authority of this permit will **NOT BE** responsible for any damage or loss caused by any fire or action taken by the permit holder. This permit does not in any way change this responsibility.
- Suitable fire breaks must be made around the planned burn site before the controlled burn begins.
- The landowner must have sufficient equipment, water, and personnel available to undertake the burn. (Refer to GSFPA Rules, Policies and Regulations- Minimum Requirements Policy).
- Burning will only be allowed 07h00-17h00 on weekdays and NO Burning will be allowed on weekends or evenings without special permission from GSFPA.
- All conditions as per application form and general rules must be adhered to.
- Supervision must be always kept until the fire is completely extinguished.
- Make sure that you adhere to the Municipal By-laws in your area.

Please be advised that, it is an offence under the National Veld and Forest Fire Act, 101 of 1998:

- To light, use or maintain a fire in the open air when the fire danger is high.
- To leave a fire unattended before the fire is extinguished.
- Not to inform adjoining neighbours of the planned burn or any fire event on your property.
- If the fire spreads and causes injury or damage.
